

CURRICULUM

The district offers general education and special education inclusion and self-contained programs in all of our schools. The district is also committed to instruction in music, art, physical education, library, world language and computer literacy by offering time within the weekly schedule for these programs. Also offered are gifted and talented enrichment programs and additional supports for Title 1 students.

The curriculum has been revised to include the New Jersey Student Learning Standards. The district's instructional goals and professional development have focused on small group learning, centers and stations,



Readers' and Writers' Workshop, higher order thinking and discussion, and increasing the infusion of technology. Our teachers take pride in conferring with small groups or individual

students in order to identify areas of strength and to provide support for areas of weakness.

Instruction in all areas and grade levels is enhanced through the use of classroom Smart Boards, document imagers and Chromebooks. Weekly use of the schools' computer lab and infusion into classroom instruction increases student technological understanding, providing

our children with the opportunity to use the computers to reinforce curricular content. Our students utilize i-Ready, Google Apps for Education, Google Classroom, Learning A-Z, Storyworks, and



several other educational websites integrated in the curriculum for each content area. There is a 1:1 Chromebook initiative in grades 3 - 6 and a 1:2 Chromebook initiative in grades K-2.
